### **Reading Skills**

Students are guided to develop essential reading strategies across various text types, ensuring effective comprehension and analysis.

### **Writing Skills**

Writing exercises focus on enhancing accuracy, cohesion, coherence, and appropriacy. Some writing tasks may be assigned as homework for further practice.

### **Listening Skills**

A range of listening tasks is incorporated to improve information processing and familiarity with different accents, fostering better comprehension.

### **Speaking Skills**

Interactive activities play a central role in encouraging communication, promoting both accuracy and fluency in real-life contexts.

### **Mediation Skills**

The international classroom environment is leveraged to develop intercultural communication and understanding, fostering effective mediation skills.

### **Linguistic Structure**

Grammatical structures are introduced through text-based study, emphasizing meaning, usage, and form to support effective communication.

### **Vocabulary Development**

Both active and passive vocabulary are integral to language acquisition. A lexical approach helps students associate words with meaning, minimizing translation issues and language interference.

### **Cultural Awareness**

Teaching materials incorporate various aspects of French life and culture, helping learners understand France and its way of life while preventing cultural misunderstandings and biases.
